

ECRC Risk Level Review:

Reassessment of the Risk Level to Which a Registrant Has Been Assigned

Minnesota Statutes 244.052 and DOC Policy 205.220, "Predatory Registrant: Registration, Notification, Public Registrant Website, and Risk Level Assessment," govern the process for reassessment of a risk level assignment.

The registrant's corrections agent, in consultation with the chief law enforcement officer in the area where the registrant resides or intends to reside, may request a review of a risk level at any time if substantial evidence exists that the registrant's risk level should be reviewed by an end-of-confinement review committee (ECRC).

This evidence includes, but is not limited to:

- i) Treatment failures or completions;
- ii) Exceptional crime-free community adjustment or lack of appropriate adjustment (minimum 3 yrs in the community);
- iii) Substantial community need to know more about the registrant;
- iv) Mitigating circumstances that would narrow the proposed scope of notification; or
- v) Other practical situations articulated and based in evidence of the registrant's behavior while under supervision.

If a recommendation is determined based upon the above information, please provide this information including notice that consultation was made with local law enforcement. **That consultation does not require agreement from local law enforcement but rather serves to provide notice to them so they are able to provide their input if desired.** Please provide dates and time periods in this information. Send that request addressed to the director of the Risk Assessment / Community Notification (RA/CN) Unit.

A decision on reassessment is the responsibility of, and will be made by, the ECRC committee. The committee may increase, reduce, or keep the risk assignment the same.

Client reaching expiration of sentence

- i) Prior to expiration, the supervision agent will conduct a review of the client's supervision status to determine whether the client has met the criteria noted above. The agent will follow the procedures noted above and provide a written recommendation to the RA/CN unit if risk level review is requested.
- ii) The agent may provide additional documentation to support a risk level review (for example, treatment providers, local stakeholders, employers, etc.)
- iii) The agent will document in CSTS the determination made regarding the risk level review.
