

Policy Number: 770.020

Title: Post-Secondary Education Student Advocacy

Effective Date: 01/02/25

PURPOSE: To provide clear parameters for individual advocacy and systems advocacy between post-secondary education student and education partner employees.

APPLICABILITY: All students housed in a Minnesota correctional facility and enrolled in a post-secondary education institution's prison education program.

DEFINITIONS:

Education partner employee – see Policy 720.020, "Education Partner Relationship."

Individual advocacy – see Policy 730.010, "Education Partner Personal Associations/Interactions between Staff and Incarcerated/Resident Students."

Systems advocacy – see Policy 730.010, "Education Partner Personal Associations/Interactions between Staff and Incarcerated/Resident Students."

Academic purposes – see Policy 730.010, "Education Partner Personal Associations/Interactions between Staff and Incarcerated/Resident Students."

PROCEDURES:

- A. Individual Advocacy
 - 1. A student may advocate on their own behalf with the education partner employee if the purpose of the advocacy is for academic purposes.
 - 2. A student may not advocate on their own behalf with the education partner employee for anything other than academic purposes. If a student wants to advocate on their own behalf about anything other than academics, they must follow the identified DOC process.
 - 3. A student may not ask an education partner employee to advocate on their behalf in their professional capacity for anything outside of the employee's academic experiences with the student.
 - 4. A student may not ask an education partner employee to personally advocate on their behalf.

B. Systems Advocacy

- 1. As with any other DOC policies, students may advocate for changes in DOC policies or rules for the education program.
- 2. A student may not advocate with education partner employees for changes in DOC policies or rules that are outside of the scope of the education program. If a student wants to advocate for changes in DOC policies or rules that are outside of the education program, they must follow the identified DOC process.

3. A student may not ask an education partner employee to personally advocate for changes in DOC policies or rules.

INTERNAL CONTROLS:
